Analog Literacies and Digital Platforms: Addressing Hope, Fear, and Healing in a Climate of Rising Nationalism



ABSTRACT: Particularly in the current U.S. political climate, youth civic lives are fraught with complicated emotions in classrooms with teachers fearful of engaging in rancorous political talk while also maintaining powerful opportunities for engagement in outof-school contexts. Presenting findings from several studies, this talk explores the intersection of digital and analog literacies in classrooms, in tabletop gaming communities, and in out-ofschool civic learning environments. Across these studies, this presentation offers a speculative analysis of differences of identity and expression, and manifests ideological commitments to equity, empathy, and collective struggle to ward off civic disintegration.
